Phuket Hotel Market Update

February 2017

Russian arrivals back to pre-financial crisis level, as zero-baht tourism curbs

Q4 growth rate

Independent properties shift to chains with 6 hotels branded

"With total airport arrivals to Phuket surpassing 7.5 million passengers, the Province experienced a higher year-on-year growth rate in 2016 of 18% compared to 13% the previous year. This is largely attributed to the resurgence of the Russian source market, which increased by 51% last year. The rebound was prompted by the strengthening of the Ruble against the Thai Baht, and political volatility in the Middle East that redirected Russian tourists to the island during high season.

Another notable source market is Mainland China, whose arrivals were substantially affected after a nationwide government crackdown on zero-baht tourism in September of last year. The growth rate of Chinese travelers for FY2016 was down to 11% versus 35% in the previous year. However, the impact from the new enforcement is expected to soften in early

2017 with more Chinese FIT's arriving during Chinese New Year.

The balance between two major source markets ended the year on a positive note as hotels' market-wide RevPAR rose by 4%. We see the industry continuing to attract new developments with more brand affiliated properties. Currently, a total of 5,584 keys are expected to come on stream by 2020."

Trends

- South Korea and the United Kingdom both moved in the top 5 international source markets, with an increase of 21% and 20% in passenger arrivals, respectively.
- Growth of inbound domestic flights almost doubled that of international routes, with y-o-y achieving 20% compared to 11%.
- Hotel pipeline has a strong trend towards branded properties, with approximately 79% of total keys in new developments brand-affiliated and 21% independent.

Forward Outlook


- Renovation of Phuket International Airport's domestic terminal, scheduled to be completed in Q4 2017, will link the international and domestic terminals and ease passenger traffic.
- Ultimatum for unregistered hotels to obtain a hotel license in 2017 will help push Phuket's lower-tier hotels to a higher operating standard.
- Mega projects such as the Central Festival expansion, Blu Pearl luxury mall, multiple underpasses and planned light rail project are redefining the broader tourism market.

Airline Indicators


• In 2016, Phuket International Airport hosted a total of 7,549,346 inbound passengers, with 46% coming from domestic arrivals and 54% from international flights.

Phuket Airport International & Domestic Passenger Arrivals




Propertical sector had sector had stronger y-o-y growth rate of 19% last year compared to 16% for international passengers

Hotel Supply

• Thailand's Ministry of Tourism and Sports' hotel supply data was amended to include both registered and unregistered tourist accommodations in 2016. Phuket currently has a total of 81,727 keys in 1,744 establishments. There are 32 hotels in the island's pipeline.


